Adverb

→ It describes a verb, an adjective or another adverb.

Examples: quickly,
yesterday, seldom



Pronoun

→ It takes the place of a noun.

Examples:

I, she, he, we, they,
it, her, his, them



Noun

→ It is a name of a
person, thing, place or
idea.

Examples:

teacher, mountain,
Paul, Baguio City



Verb

→ It shows an action or state of being.

Examples:

jump, write, read

think, listen, pray,

wash, are, is



Interjection

→ It shows a strong emotion or reaction.

Examples:

Ouch! Wow!

Bravo! Hooray!

Oh my!



Preposition

→ It is used before a noun, a pronoun or gerund to show place, time, or direction.

Examples: in, on, under, from, below



Adjective

→ It describes a noun
or a pronoun.

Examples:

happy, prayerful,
honest, red, sweet,
one, three



Conjunction

→ It joins words, ideas or phrases in a sentence.

Examples:

but, and, nor,

because, therefore
